Eligibility Requirements for Applicants**

1. Applicant must attend one of the following high schools in Washington, D.C.:

2. Applicant must have a cumulative GPA equal to or greater than 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.
3. Applicant must be a citizen of the United States or be a U.S. Lawful Permanent Resident.
4. Applicant must be a graduating senior enrolled full time as a high school student (enrolled for at least four credits during the applicant’s current and final year) at a participating DC high school.
5. Applicant must graduate from high school with their class in June and plan to enroll full time in college no later than the fall following completion of high school.
6. Applicant’s transcript must demonstrate college preparedness such as AP/IB courses, honors courses, or college preparedness courses (seminars or other classes to help with college applications, SAT/ACT preparedness).
7. Applicant must demonstrate interest and participation in extracurricular activities and community service. Leadership roles should be emphasized and are preferred.
8. Applicant must complete the FAFSA and include a copy of the FAFSA Submission Summary. Proof that a student has submitted their FAFSA will be accepted with the understanding that the Summary must be provided prior to any award.
9. Applicant must plan to attend a college or university within the 50 United States or Washington, D.C.
10. Applicants who accept full scholarships (inclusive of tuition, room and board) for any school, including the GWU Trachtenberg Scholarship and the American University District Scholars Award, are not eligible for the award.
